The Practice

1. What issue inspired the nominated project or practice?

The Federal Governments mandated closure of coal fired power generation with accelerated timelines, namely Shand Power Station, Boundary Dam units 3, 4, 5 and eventually 6. These will most certainly result in the loss of hundreds, if not thousands of local jobs, and drastic changes to the tax base for every municipal government in the region, most especially in the R.M # 5 (Estevan), R.M #4 (Coalfields), and the town of Bienfait. These three municipal governing bodies decided to form an economic partnership. This regional economic partnership and formal economic development program serves the unique needs and challenges of member rural municipalities to: facilitate regional economic development services, attract investment, and major project development. SSEP members realized that they needed to take matters into their own hands to affect positive change for their future.

2. What has this project or practice done to address the issue?

Developed a formal MOU with the City of Estevan to work collaboratively on regional economic development.

Created the framework and governance of the Municipal Coal Transition Assistance Program that was provided by the province to assist companies interested in investing in southeastern Saskatchewan.

Developed a Regional Economic Development Plan and an Investment Attraction website.

Spearheading major transformational initiatives such as irrigation, recreation development, tourism, and marina.

Successfully obtained federal funding for the following municipal infrastructure project (includes the total project budget):

- Airport Road Rehabilitation (\$2.68 million)
- Kensington Ave North to Estevan Bypass Upgrade (\$1.37 million)
- Town of Bienfait Firehall (\$1.55 million)
- Bienfait to Lampman Interconnect (\$4.62 million)
- Bienfait Tourism Assets Revitalization (\$147 thousand)

All 3 Municipal Councils created the vision and established a working committee with RMs and a town.

All 3 Municipal Administrations formalized the committee structure and obtained funding from Western Economic Diversification for a two-year pilot project for the creation of a regional economic partnership and economic development program.

5. Were other groups were involved in developing this project or practice? If so, who were they and what role did they play?

Western Economic Diversification - provided funding for economic development funding program.

6. What resources were involved?

The municipal economic development committee hired Keating Business Strategies Ltd. (KBSL) as a contractor to create and facilitate regional economic development services and related programming.

KBSL is one of the leading rural economic development agencies in western Canada with over 20 years of experience and specialty working with rural and Indigenous communities.

7. How was the project or practice developed?

The project was developed in the following manner:



1 - Strategic Planning Session of three members

2 - Completed a GAP Assessment and an inventory of regional assets and competitive advantages.

3 - Developed business cases for the identified opportunities

4 - Created a Regional Economic Development Strategy with six key pillars for development, which include: Value-added Agriculture Processing, Logistics & Distribution Hub, Water for Economic Development, Destination Tourism, Resource Innovation, Municipal Infrastructure for Economic Development

5 - Developed an MOU with the City of Estevan for regional economic development and cooperation

6 - Created the Municipal Coal Transition Assistance Program in partnership with the City of Estevan and Province of Saskatchewan

7 - Incorporated SSEP as an official non-for-profit regional economic partnership.

The Results

8. What effect did this project or practice have on the community?

To date, there have been several impacts on the community.

1 - Rural municipalities have their own voice for economic development.

2 - SSEP has been successful in achieving over \$8 million in infrastructure projects, including Kensington and Airport Road, Grid 605, Bienfait Firehall, Bienfait Downtown Revitalization.

3 - Several new businesses have started and new jobs created as a direct result of the MCTAP program. To date, this program has created 15 jobs and is growing.

9. Was a formal evaluation done after the project or practice was completed? Please explain.

A formal evaluation was not completed as the project is in the implementation phase. SSEP is tracking jobs created and investments in the region.



10. Describe any challenges faced.

1 - Moving from a singular economic development program to a regional one.

2 - Challenges getting incorporated with SaskRegistries.

3 - Focusing on regional projects and priorities versus individual municipal needs and wants.

Lessons Learned

11. What lessons were learned and what would you recommend doing differently? Lessons learned:

- There is strength in partnerships
- More can be achieved working together than individually
- Companies should co-invest in projects to get grants
- Don't lose sight of the long-term vision and goals
- Results will come but takes time and perseverance
